Miraloma Elementary School Gardens: A New Era!

Miraloma recently re-launched their garden program with the help of Urban Sprouts (<https://urbansprouts.org/>), fully funded by the PTA! Urban Sprouts provides a garden teacher two days a week who engages in garden and science topics for each grade. In addition, the PTA has created a Garden & Grounds Committee which is open to caregivers, neighbors, and those in the Miraloma community.

Miraloma recently had a major re-fresh of the lower playground garden and a clean-up of the upper outdoor spaces. For many years, kindergarten teacher Gillian Schmitz and parent volunteers lovingly tended the space, growing vegetables and sensory plants. Students loved exploring the gardens. During Covid, the upper garden was generously maintained by Chris VerPlanck (school neighbor and Miraloma Life author). The lower garden was not accessible and it became overgrown with weeds.

We are excited about getting children back into the natural spaces adjacent to the school!

The Miraloma Park Improvement Club is conducting an election for certain Officer and Board Member positions from **June 10 through 18, 2026**.

Eligibility To Vote

Persons 18+ years, who were dues-paying members of the Miraloma Park Improvement Club as of May 10, 2026, are eligible to vote.

Voting Procedures

This election is being conducted using electronic and paper ballot procedures. Voters may cast ballots electronically or in person at the MPIC Clubhouse, but not by both procedures.

Electronic Balloting from June 10 to 17

MPIC dues-paying members who have given MPIC their email addresses will be sent a link to vote electronically. On June 8 MPIC will email these eligible voters a link to the electronic ballot. Or, beginning on June 10 voters can access the electronic ballot by visiting <https://miralomapark.org/news-events/> and clicking on Election Notice. The Election Notice (pdf) will include a link to the electronic ballot.

Follow the directions on the ballot. After you vote, you will receive confirmation that your ballot has been accepted.

You may vote electronically, beginning June 10. Electronic balloting **closes on June 17 at 11:59pm**.

In-Person Voting on June 18

If you would like to vote a paper ballot, you may do so at the MPIC Clubhouse on **June 18, between 6:30pm and 7:00pm**.

Tally of Ballots

All votes cast (both electronically and in-person) will be tallied on June 18, 2026, and the results will be announced at the MPIC Membership Meeting on July 18 at the MPIC Clubhouse, on the MPIC website and in the September issue of Miraloma Life.

Remembering Darlene Ramlose

It is with deep sadness that I announce that long time MPIC Board member Darlene Ramlose passed away in May.

Darlene moved to Miraloma Park in 2014 where I first met her at our Resilient Miraloma Park community workshops. Darlene had a professional background in working with older adults, health care, nutrition and disaster

preparedness. She immediately volunteered to be a member of our inaugural Resilient Miraloma Park working group.

Soon after Darlene volunteered to serve as co-coordinator for the Miraloma Park NERT team (Neighborhood Emergency Response Team), then became an MPIC Board member, then one of our original Block Champions as well as an Emergency Radio Operator.

One of the key goals of our Resilient Miraloma Park initiative was a focus on our seniors and vulnerable populations. Darlene dedicated her life to advocating and empowering the vulnerable - especially seniors. In 2017, Darlene submitted a proposal under Supervisor Norman Yee's District 7 Participatory Budget program to fund the launch of the first ever Miraloma Community Connectors program for seniors.

"Miraloma Park Community Connector, an intergenerational aging in place model. Miraloma Park does not have a Senior Center. However, this project will be a "community center without walls" modeled after a successful program in the Cayuga neighborhood. This project will encourage neighbors to help each other, reduce older adult isolation, promote socialization, and offer programs and activities so that neighbors stay active, engaged and remain in their homes for as long as possible."

Thanks to Darlene's efforts, the Miraloma Community Connectors program obtained initial funding of \$25,000. Darlene became the program coordinator. Since the program's inception, Darlene has worked closely with the Community Living Campaign and the SF Aging and Adult Services to keep the Miraloma Community Connectors program thriving.

Darlene quickly grew the Miraloma Community Connectors program to over 100 seniors with free senior exercise classes twice a week, a weekly ukulele class, and special celebrations on holidays including tea parties. She planned social and educational activities with guest speakers on topics such as nutrition, diary writing, arts and crafts, disaster preparedness and preparing vials of life. She also started the weekly Friday Zoom call social hour to help keep seniors connected.

In 2019, Darlene submitted another proposal under Sup. Norman Yee's District 7 Participatory Budget program called "Miraloma's Vulnerable Residents Care and Shelter Program" which later won funding. With Darlene's leadership, the MPIC acquired a substantial cache of equipment and supplies for mass shelter, mass feeding, power, lighting, medical, sanitation, communication and mass care. The result was the genesis for today's MPIC Resilient Care and Shelter program. Darlene was extremely focused on the needs of seniors in Miraloma Park. I know she wanted to see the Care and Shelter program initiated. It was her passion even when she was going through some very difficult health issues. We will continue her work and think of her as we do so.

Her leadership during the Covid pandemic will always be remembered as nothing less than inspirational. Darlene immediately began making wellness calls to over 160 seniors. Did any of these seniors need help in acquiring groceries? Did they need a medication pick up at the local pharmacy? Did they need regular wellness calls just to make sure they were ok?

Darlene worked with our Block Champions and NERTS to quickly spring into action to deliver COVID-19 information flyers and door-hangers throughout Miraloma Park while at the same time checking in on our vulnerable, elderly and disabled shut-ins on their blocks. Darlene was an integral part of our team that came together making calls, sending emails, shopping for shut-in neighbors and working with Supervisor Yee in the SOS program to make wellness calls to seniors.

In 2023, Darlene led the effort to secure a Community Living Campaign grant to fund one of the most memorable Community Connector events held: "Perry Sings Sinatra" at the MPIC clubhouse. Darlene planned the event from start to finish. Over 60 Community Connectors from Miraloma, Sunnyside and Midtown Terrace enjoyed a traditional Italian meatball and spaghetti dinner while listening to an amazing Perry D'Andrea serenade Sinatra songs to the attendees.

In 2023, Darlene also donned her Block Champion hat and teamed up with neighbors to organize a large Octoberfest block party at Detroit and Melrose that was attended by 150 in the neighborhood. Darlene was always focused on bringing neighbors together.

Darlene contributed so much to our community. As the MPIC continues to advance on our mission of inclusive disaster resilience – Darlene's legacy will be forever present in our community.
